



## Mrs. Caitlin C. Brunton

October 31, 1982 - January 18, 2022

Caitlin Caroline Brunton, nee Caitlin Caroline Pumphrey, age 39, died on Tuesday, January 18, 2022 at Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston, surrounded by her loving family. She is survived by her husband, Steven Brunton, and their son, Alexander Brunton, of Topsfield, Massachusetts. She will be remembered by her many friends and extended family for her upbeat attitude, her beautiful smile, and her infectious laugh. Caitlin lit up every room she walked into. One of her friends said that "Caitlin has always been such a ray of sunshine."

Her greatest pleasures were pool days with Alex; trips to Hilton Head with her in-laws, Carol and Doug Brunton; going to Tanglewood; Broadway musicals; seeking out the perfect lobster roll; enjoying spa days with her mother and sister; and finding the perfect gifts for the people she loved.
