Lynn Campbell, 54, of Parkview Terrace, died Thursday evening at Berkshire Medical Center in Pittsfield. Born in Guisborough in Yorkshire, England, on February 17, 1961, the daughter of Alastair and Dorothy (nee Thomson) Campbell. Lynn attended schools in Redcar, England and continued her education after immigrating to the U.S. After several years living in Florida and other eastern states, Lynn settled in the Berkshires where she worked as a Massage Therapist at home, the Healing Place and Canyon Ranch. Lynn was also a talented artist with varying mediums including painting and sculpting. And as a vocal advocate for the animal rights and welfare, Lynn was a regular supporter of shelters and animal rescue endeavors. Besides her mother of Redcar, England, Lynn is survived by her partner of 20 years, Leonard H. Forrest of Lee and her brothers, James Campbell of Edinburgh, Scotland, and Stuart Campbell of Middlesbrough, England. Beloved niece of Hannah Campbell and Bob and Mary Thomson and adoring auntie to Cameron, Lucy, Hannah and Jenny Campbell. Further survived by many loving cousins on both sides of the Atlantic.
