Aaron James MacArthur, 54, of North Street died Sunday, February 14th at Berkshire Medical Center after suffering a heart attack.

Born in Boston February 10, 1962 to James MacArthur and the late Francis Bearce MacArthur, he attended Brookline Schools. He went on to earn his Bachelor's degree in Economics and Marketing at Dartmouth College in 1985.

After graduation, Aaron worked in the Boston area in Sales and Marketing for various companies, most recently as a Sales Representative for Direct Mail Marketing until becoming disabled.

Mr. MacArthur enjoyed reading and educating himself about all Christian Religions. He was a Boston Red Sox fan and also routed for the Boston Bruins. Aaron and his wife enjoyed nights out at the theater. He was a communicant of St. Stephen's Church in Pittsfield and St. Agnes Church in Dalton.

Aaron and his wife, Patricia Conway MacArthur, formerly of Turners falls, were married July 11, 2011 in Pittsfield at St. Stephen's Episcopal Church.

Besides his wife of Dalton and his father of Lenox, Mr. MacArthur leaves three siblings: Demetrius MacArthur of Salem, MA, Melissa MacArthur of Mattapan,

MA, and Patricia MacArthur of Dalton, MA.

He is predeceased by his mother Francis Bearce MacArthur and a step-brother, Jeffrey.
