Carmen Marie Coderre Liston, 92, of Lenox Dale, died Sunday morning at Kindred- Laurel Lake Center in Lee.

Born in Winsted, CT on September 7, 1921, the daughter of Rodolphe E. and Armandine Daunais Coderre, she grew up in Northampton and moved to Lenox Dale in 1937. She graduated from Lenox High School in 1940.

Mrs. Liston was employed in the accounting department of the former Smith Paper Co. in Lee from 1942 - 1952 and from 1972 until her retirement in 1980 she was the secretary for the Town of Lenox Department of Public Works.

She was a communicant of St. Vincent de Paul Church in Lenox Dale.

Mrs. Liston and her husband, Charles J. Liston, were married July 4, 1952.

Besides her husband of Lenox Dale, she is survived by her daughter, Sally J. Vincent and her husband Jeffrey T. Vincent of Lenox; two sons, Monsignor Daniel P. Liston of Springfield and Gary T. Liston of Lenox; and one grandson, J. Nicholas Vincent of Boston. Besides her parents she was predeceased by her son, Timothy C. Liston in 1976, her sister Jacqueline Bouchard, and her brothers Germain Coderre and F. Andre Coderre.
