



Mr Edgar W Winslow

LENOX—Edgar Willard “Bill” Winslow, 95, of Plunkett Street died March 8, 2016.

Bill is remembered for his sunny disposition and sense of humor, which he maintained to the end. His patience and positive attitude made him a great husband, father, family man, and loyal friend too many. He was rarely without his beloved Springer Spaniels. He took much delight in tending his flower gardens in summer and cozying up by the fireplace in winter.

He married Deborah Clark Sanders in Lucerne, Switzerland on June 5, 1971. Theirs was a marriage of unsurpassed love. His greatest passion was his family, with whom he traveled the world.

Bill was born in Wilmington, DE, on November 8, 1920 to the late William Sprague Winslow and Sadie Fish Winslow. He graduated from Hyde Park High School in Boston, and Columbia University in New York City, where he obtained a bachelor’s degree in business. He served in the US Army Signal Corps in England during World War II as a member of the intelligence team. He was a marketing manager at G.E. Pittsfield and Waterford, NY, and later created Winard Advertising Agency, which evolved into the Graphic Arts Center, and included Coyle Printing and Mailing, Display Concepts, the Berkshire Institute of Marketing Research, and Winard News Service.

Bill was on the board of directors of the Pittsfield YMCA for many years and a member of the Berkshire Hills Country Club. Handball, sailing, and golfing were favorite pastimes.

Besides his wife of 44 years, Bill is survived by three children: Tiffany Wilding-White (husband Carter) of Lee; Linda A. Winslow of Washington, D.C, David Winslow of Oregon, two grandchildren, and nieces and nephews. He was predeceased by his son William J. Winslow, and sister Margaret Hogg.
