Gloria Palma Antonangeli, 88, of Lenox, died Friday evening at Berkshire Place.

Born in Lenox July 8, 1932, the daughter of Romildo and Bettina Dicicco Antonangeli, Gloria attended Lenox schools and was a 1950 graduate of Lenox High School.

She attended the former Berkshire Business College in Pittsfield and after completion of her courses was employed at the former House of Mercy (now Berkshire Medical Center) as Cashier in the Business Office, retiring after 43 years of devoted service.

Gloria was proud of her home town and its history, and proud to have lived her life in the house where she was born. She enjoyed working in her vegetable and flower gardens and taking care of her yard.

A lifelong communicant of St. Ann Parish, she was a member of the St. Ann Rosary-Altar Society, and ran the bake sale at the Parish's annual "Big Event" fund raiser. She also served on the Berkshire Federal Credit Union Loan Committee for 15 years.

Survivors include her cousins; Betty Petroni and Mildred Gaudreau (Gerald), of Walpole, MA; and many devoted, lifelong friends. She was predeceased by her parents and by her beloved sister Anita A. Antonangeli.
