



## Mr. Hugh C. Cowhig

September 9, 1934 - April 18, 2026

Hugh Curley Cowhig, 91, of Lenox, died at Baystate Medical Center on Saturday, April 18th after a brief illness.

Born on September 9, 1934, in Pittsfield, MA., to the late Daniel and Mary "Bess" Ward Cowhig, he attended Lenox schools, class of 1952. After high school, Hugh attended Holy Cross College and received a BS in Business in 1956. He was enlisted in the United States Army and was honorably discharged in 1959.

Hugh received his Juris Doctorate from Western New England College in 1967. He practiced Law until his retirement in 2004.

Mr. Cowhig married Nancy Kratzsch in Lenox on September 20, 1958.

He was a communicant of St. Ann's Church in Lenox and was a proud member of the Alford Brook Club. He was a Director of the Lenox National Bank, served on the Lenox Zoning Board of Appeals, on the Lenox Democratic Town Committee and as Lenox Town Moderator. He was Town Counsel for several Berkshire County towns for more than 30 years, including Lenox, Monterey, New Ashford and Ripton. He enjoyed reading, travel, Red Sox baseball, college basketball (go Crusaders!), acting with the Vineyard Community and Bill Gibson, genealogy, and his grandchildren.

Besides his wife Nancy of Lenox, Hugh is survived by his sons; Sean M. Cowhig of Lenox, and Daniel J. Cowhig of Las Vegas, NV, and his grandchildren; Ian, Aidan, and Liam Cowhig. He is pre-deceased by his siblings, Theodore Cowhig and Mary Quinn.

A Liturgy of Christian burial will be held on Monday, April 27, 2026, at 10:00AM with Monsignor John Bonzagni officiating. There will be no calling hours.
