Louis Charles Stohr, 87, of Bartlett Avenue in Pittsfield and formerly of Lee, MA and Oldsmar, FL passed away on Wednesday December 28, 2016 surrounded by his loving family after a courageous fight. "Louie" was born and raised in Cincinnati, OH and was a proud veteran of the U.S. Navy. He served on the U.S.S. Kearsarge at the end of WWII and during the Korean War. A jack-of-all-trades, Louie built his family home in Lee. After retiring from his career in manufacturing, Louie's passion of horses led him to fulfill his dream of becoming a licensed trainer and eventual owner of race horses, traveling the circuit between New Hampshire and Florida.

Louie lost his beautiful wife of 35 years Claire Carrstedt on February 28, 1983. He was also predeceased by his sister Dolores Brandt of Cincinnati, OH; his brother William of El Monte, CA; his son-in-law Joe Davis of South Lee; and his grandson Eric Ketchen, of Great Barrington.

He is survived by his children Cheryl Ketchen of Venice, FL; Debbie Rock of Port Charlotte, FL; Pam Whitman and her husband Brian of Peoria, AZ; Susan Silver and her husband Mike of Lee; Lisa Stohr of Pittsfield, with whom he made his home for the last several months; and his son Rick Stohr of Pittsfield; as well as his grandchildren: Shaun Ketchen, Brian and Jason Zerbato, Rachel, Amy and Claire Rock, Heather Wells Armstrong, Eric and Jeff Wells, Mike and Emily Silver, Justin Stohr, Jesse and Amanda Rivers, and Ben Stohr; 12 great-grandchildren, and Dean Wells of South Lee.

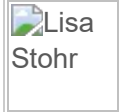

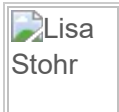
