



Mr. Michael T. Field

November 12, 1943 - April 25, 2023

Michael T. Field, 79, otherwise known as Mike, "MT", Mikie, Fieldsie, and Uncle Mike of Lenox died peacefully, surrounded by his loving family on Tuesday, April 25th at his brother and sister-in-laws home where he had resided during his brief illness.

Mike was born on November 12, 1943 in Pittsfield, MA., to the late Robert and Elizabeth Byrne Field. He attended Lenox High School and was a 1962 graduate. After high school, Mike enlisted in the United States Army where he served in Germany during the Vietnam War. He was honorably discharged on October 23rd, 1965.

M.T. worked as a truck driver for much of his career, later owning and operating his own tractor-trailer, and for the last 10 years was a self-employed landscaper. He was a communicant of St. Ann's Church.

Mike was an animal lover throughout his life and was a talented artist (drawing) and photographer. He enjoyed collecting antique cars and trucks as well as wooden hand-carved toy cars and trucks. He enjoyed every weekend at Lebanon Valley Speedway during the summer months, was an avid reader, and a parade lover and participant. He was a member of the Lane-Conklin-Coakley VFW Post #12079 and loved playing Santa Clause, starting when he was in the service and continuing through the years at VFW Christmas parties, and on the annual Polar Express and Christmas Train. Mike was a natural comedian.

(Catherine) of Naples, FL., and Dennis G. Field (Debra Kelly) of Lenox, MA., nieces and nephew; Elaine Martin Fellers, Kevin Field, Nichole Field-Perkins, and Rebecca Field.

Besides his parents, Mike is predeceased by his siblings; Robert Field, Jr., Patricia Bierbaum, Richard Field and Terrance Field and nephew Anthony Martin.

The funeral for Mr. Michael T. Field will be held on Wednesday May 3rd, 2023, at 12 noon at St. Ann's Church with Monsignor John Bonzagni, officiating. Burial will follow in St. Ann's cemetery.
