Peter A. Maturevich, 78, died Sunday December 7th at his home in Lenox. He was born on November 3, 1947, in Pittsfield, MA., to the late Anthony and Yvonne Penvenne Maturevich. He attended Lenox High School, graduating in 1967. After high school, Peter enlisted in the United States Army and served during Vietnam. He was honorably discharged in 1969.

Pete worked as a heavy equipment operator for various businesses throughout his career; Maxymillian, Petricca, and LB Corp. He was a member of Local 98. He enjoyed hunting, drag racing, and classic cars.

Mr. Maturevich is survived by his children; Jacob A. Maturevich (Michelle Johnson) of Lenox, and Michelle Maturevich-Hilt (William York) of Southampton, grandson; Harley Hilt and his father, Scott Hilt, sister; Missy (Olga Marie) Avildsen of New York, and many nieces and nephews.
