Scott Douglas Kuhlman, 46, died on November 9th, 2020 of natural causes at his home in Bear, DE.

He was born in Pittsfield on March 25, 1974, the son of Barbara Hoffman Kuhlman and the late Paul Kuhlman. Scott was a 1992 graduate of Lenox Memorial High School and later earned his BA degree in communications from Fitchburg State College. He was employed by Mass Illusions and then worked as a website designer for several years before becoming a licensed electrician and a member of the IBEW. Scott enjoyed the outdoors, brought a creative flare to projects, and always rooted for the underdog. Scott was loved and will be greatly missed by family and friends.

He is survived by his mother, sister, and son. A graveside service, private to the family, will take place on Monday at Mountain View Cemetery in Lenox with the Rev. David Hurst of Lenox officiating.
